Note 2- Each class should be kept in a separate bag under double locks. The bag should of each pair of columns.

Note 3- When a remittance of cut coins is received from another treasury the amounts as name of the treasury being entered below the date of receipt. Any corrections that may be pelted, should be made subsequently by plus and minus entries.

Note 4- When a remittance is dispatched a total should be made in each column in red ink be entered and a balance struck. A similar total should be made at the end of each month.
